Itera Leads National Hilal Observation for Eid Determination

March 17, 2026



Institut Teknologi Sumatera was selected as one of the official sites for hilal observation to determine the beginning of Eid al-Fitr (1 Syawal) in Indonesia. The observation took place in March 2026 at the Observatorium Astronomi Itera Lampung (OAIL), involving trained observers and advanced telescope systems. This activity is part of a national effort coordinated to ensure accurate and reliable determination of the Islamic calendar.

The observation was conducted using four telescopes and supported by a team of astronomy experts and researchers from Itera. The process aims to detect the crescent moon (hilal) after sunset, which is a key requirement in determining the start of Syawal. By participating in this national agenda, Itera contributes scientific data and expertise to support religious and governmental decision-making.

This involvement highlights how science and religion can work together in a practical context. Itera plays an important role by providing facilities, technology, and human resources to support the process. Through OAIL, the university continues to strengthen its position as a center for astronomy research and public service in Indonesia.
